District 16 International Speech Contest

Saturday, May 16, 2009

Always the highlight of the conference weekend is the International Speech Contest held immediately prior to the banquet on Saturday evening.

This all started with individual club contests held in February. The winners of these contests progressed to the Area level in March and winners from these contests competed again at the Division level in April. Two winners from each of the Division contests will compete at the District Conference in May. Who will be named the Winner? Nobody knows! A Judging Team made up of approximately nine trained judges, two timekeepers and three ballot counters will arrive at this decision based on the performance of the speakers competing that evening.

The District 16 contest winner will compete in the Region III Contest on June 19 and 20 in Denver, Colorado. The winner of that contest will compete with speakers from around the world at the Toastmasters International Conference in August 2009 and one will be named "World's Champion Speaker." Only two Toastmasters from District 16 have held this honor: Harold Patterson in 1987 and Dave Ross in 1991.

To be eligible to compete in the International contests, each speaker must complete an *Eligibility Form* stating that he/she is a member in good standing of a club in good standing; has given at least six speeches from the Competent Communication manual prior to the club contest; that the speech is substantially original; and that the contestant has prepared his/her own 5-7 minute speech.

Communication and Leadership Award



Stanley L. Evans, JD. has been selected as the recipient of District 16's 2009 Communication and Leadership Award. He will be recognized for these accomplishments at the Awards Luncheon on May 16 at the District Conference.

He assumed the position of Assistant Dean for Students at the University of Oklahoma College of Law in August, 2003. This was almost exactly three months after his graduation from the College of Law in May of that year. His selection for this position was unprecedented in two ways. It is almost unheard of for a person to be a student one year, and be the Assistant Dean responsible for all student related actions and activities the following year. Second, Dean Evans is the first African American to be appointed to a Dean position at any law school in the state of

Oklahoma. As Assistant Dean for Students, he has responsibilities encompassing the entire range of law student activities and services.

Dean Evans was appointed by Governor Keating, and then again by Governor Henry to the Oklahoma Human Rights Commission. For the past 4 years he has energized the entire state and sought recognition for people that have been giants in this important area of Oklahoma History through his role of managing the State's annual Human Rights Day Program. In 2008, he was selected as the Chairman of the Oklahoma Human Rights Commission. He currently provides leadership to the nine person commission and the two state offices. He recently completed his second term on the Board of Trustees of the University of Saint Mary - Leavenworth, KS.

He retired from the United States Army in March, 2000, with 32 years of military service, and started law school at the age of 54. Colonel Evans' final military assignment was as Dean of Students and Administration for the Army's Command and General Staff College at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas. There, he was responsible for the daily operations and management of the Army's premier academic institution that had a yearly student body of over 5700 officers and an annual budget of \$12,000,000. In the Leavenworth area, he was well known as a motivational speaker and led the Fort's effort to provide over 700 computers to Kansas public schools. He also served on many boards and organizations within the area. In Leavenworth, he was honored as the Alpha Phi Alpha "Man of the Year" in 1998 and again in 1999.

From 1995 to 1997, Colonel Evans was the Garrison Commander of Fort Leavenworth, where twice during his tenure; the Fort was selected as runner-up for "Best Managed Fort in the Army." The winning of this national Malcolm Baldrige competition netted the Fort a \$75,000 cash prize both years. Fort Leavenworth was also designated as the "Best Hometown in the Army" under his leadership.

Born in Athens, Texas, and raised in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, he is a 1964 graduate of Douglass HS. He earned a Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) Degree at the University of Central Oklahoma and was awarded a Masters Degree in Business Administration (MBA) at the University of Texas (Tyler). Dean Evans received his Juris Doctor (JD) at the University of Oklahoma. His professional military education includes graduation from the Army Command and General Staff College at Ft Leavenworth, KS and the Army War College at Carlisle, PA.

Colonel Evans is a Viet-Nam War Veteran, who has received numerous Military Honors and Awards, including the *Distinguished Service Medal, the Legion of Merit*, and the *Bronze Star*. He also received the Silver Order of Mercury for service as the 5th Regimental Adjutant of the U.S. Army Signal Corps, where he oversaw the revision of the entire Signal Enlisted Soldier Career Structure. He was also selected to the OCS Hall of Fame at Ft Sill, OK in 1997 for other contributions to the United States Army.

He was singled out by the Oklahoma City Urban League to receive its Annual Equal Opportunity Community Recognition Award in 2005. He also received Governor Henry's Commendation for his work in Human Rights in 2003.

Dean Evans and his wife are very active in their church - Wildewood Christian, Oklahoma City - where he was the chairman of a recently completed \$2,500,000 sanctuary construction project. He also leads "Children's Church" on a monthly basis, works with the HS youth, and operates as a counselor when the church sends over 50 youth to a Kids Across America (KAA) weeklong camp in southern Missouri each summer. Several years ago, he chaired the constitution committee that wrote the rules and guidelines under which the church currently operates. He and Saundra have established several scholarships in the memory of their daughter Lee Evans, a former Oklahoma City TV news anchor,, including an annual \$1000 scholarship for an Oklahoma City HS senior active in community activities, and an annual \$4000 scholarship for an OU journalism major. Dean and Mrs. Evans currently reside in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma.
